### **Minutes: General Meeting, March 14, 2007**

The Cradle of Texas Chapter has trained 118 volunteers since 2001, of which 94 have certified. There are presently 79 active members, of which 72 turn in hours. There were 64 who recertified in 2006. The chapter has 90% participation by its membership.

**Marty Cornell** reviewed the presentation he gave at the regional meeting in Feb. Seven of the ten chapters in the region were present. He also reviewed the class fees charged by other chapters. Some chapters charge as much as \$150.00 for training, but refund \$50.00 after an intern certifies. In all the other chapters, the cost of the classes does not appear to inhibit people who are interested in the training. He also reported that all chapters have dues and some even charge \$1.00 per meeting for refreshments. The Galveston chapter promotes "fun, food and fellowship" by having covered dish meals at some of their meetings.

There being no further business, Justina introduced our speaker for the advanced training. Teri MacArthur, president of the Heartland Chapter, Montgomery/Waller counties, presented the training on "Mushrooms and other Fungi". Those attending the class receive credit for **two hours** of advanced training.
